

# The Executive Council of the State of Danubia



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***PREAMBLE:*** We, the Executive Council of State of Danubia, acting under the supreme constitutional authority granted by the Transitional Territorial Charter (ECD-TTC-2026-001), do hereby establish the permanent foundational framework for the ***Danubian Honour Guard***.

*Recognising that the visual projection of state dignity, the aesthetic preservation of institutional prestige, and the cultural presentation of sovereign identity are vital to the continuity of governance under the active territorial blockade, this Charter codifies the structure, duties, restrictions, and appearance of the state's premier disciplined civilian unit. The Honour Guard shall serve as a clinical, corporate-hardened vanguard of pageantry—entirely decoupled from military, security, or policing powers—enforcing symbolic institutional order and projecting sovereign authority.*

# **ARTICLE I: COMMAND STRUCTURE & CIVILIAN OVERSIGHT**

## **Section 1.1: Supreme Executive Command**

*The Honour Guard operates under the exclusive, ultimate command of the High Commissioner. It functions as a direct instrument of the High-Executive desk. No administrative minister or external sector moderator may deploy, re-task, or alter the protocols of the Guard without an explicit Executive Order signed by the High Commissioner.*

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## **Section 1.2: The Honour Guard Captain**

*Direct operational management, ceremonial drilling, and personnel logistics shall be vested in the Guard Captain. The Guard Captain shall be appointed directly by the High Commissioner and shall hold a non-voting advisory seat on the Executive Council during sessions involving state protocol, ceremonial planning, or territorial touchdown logistics.*

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## **Section 1.3: Inter-Commissioner Coordination**

*To maintain systemic continuity, the Guard shall coordinate its administrative logistics through two primary civilian ministries:*

- 1. **The Commission of Civil Registry (ECD-CRDA-2026-002):** To manage background screening, identity verification updates, service term monitoring, and passport issuance routing for volunteers.*
- 2. **The Commission of Infrastructure & Land Mapping (ECD-TIMA-2026-005):** To coordinate the spatial layout and physical dimensions of ceremonial grounds, future consulate properties, and touchdown staging sectors.*

## ARTICLE II: CORE DUTIES & RESPONSIBILITIES

### Section 2.1: Sovereign Diplomatic Presence

*The primary duty of the Guard is to provide immaculate ceremonial presence and formal accompaniment for the High Commissioner and members of the Executive Council during official state functions. In the event of the establishment of a physical Danubian Consulate Office or administrative hub, the Guard shall be stationed at the gates and entry halls strictly as **State Sentries** to greet visiting dignitaries and maintain institutional dignity where appropriate.*

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### Section 2.2: Public Pageantry and Formations

*When personnel numbers reach designated thresholds, the Guard is authorised to conduct public marches, formal parades, and public drills within compliant legal frameworks. These public demonstrations shall serve strictly to build civic pride, showcase the state's uniform heritage, and project the peaceful identity of Danubia.*

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### Section 2.3: Territorial Touchdown Mandate

*It is explicitly recognised that the Honour Guard's active, full-scale operational deployment is conditional, and the unit **shall remain functionally dormant regarding physical field duties until the Administration successfully achieves a physical presence on the land.** Upon the execution of the physical touchdown operation, the Guard shall lead the ceremonial vanguard, raising the state flag and providing the aesthetic framework for the initial administrative address.*

## ARTICLE III: CODES OF DRESS & VISUAL HIERARCHY

To balance modern corporate utility during the transitional blockade phase with historic European prestige during physical state deployments, the Honour Guard operates under a dual-tier apparel framework. The base cloth for all primary uniform items shall be a clinical, high-contrast **Jet Black** or a deep **Midnight Navy** to ensure exact institutional matching.

### Section 3.1: Standard Duty Attire (The Staging Uniform)

All active, verified volunteers of the Honour Guard shall be initially issued the premium **Standard Duty Polo Shirt** upon formal enrolment. This serves as the routine uniform for administrative work, digital broadcasts, and standard civilian representation.

1. **Foot Guards (Tier I):** A heavyweight Jet Black pique polo shirt featuring the Silver Honour Guard Seal embroidered on the left chest.
2. **Guard Captain & Troop Leaders (Tier II-A):** A heavyweight Jet Black pique polo shirt featuring the Gold Honour Guard Seal embroidered on the left chest.
3. **Executive Council & High Commissioner (Tiers II-B / III):** A premium Midnight Navy polo shirt featuring the Gold Danubian State Crest embroidered on the left chest.

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### Section 3.2: Controlled Issuance of Ceremonial Dress Uniforms

The full Ceremonial Dress Uniform—comprising the historical tunic, tailored legwear, and specialised headwear—is strictly classified as state-owned property. These complete ceremonial kits **shall be formally issued to members exclusively when active duties require it**, including but not limited to: official consulate sentry postings, public marches, formal parades, and on-land state addresses following the physical touchdown operation.

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### Section 3.3: Tier I Ceremonial Specification (The Foot Guards)

1. **Jacket:** Embroidered Tunic in Jet Black with **Gold Embroidery** detailing on the collar and cuffs.
  2. **Trousers:** Slim, tailored **Jet Black Trousers** featuring a sharp, single, vertical Slate Grey stripe stitched down the outside seam of each leg; paired with mirror-shined black dress boots.
  3. **Headwear:** A pristine, **Jet Black wool beret** worn in the tight European style, featuring a centrally mounted **Silver Honour Guard Seal**.
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### **Section 3.4: Tier II-A Ceremonial Specification (The Guard Captain & Officers)**

1. **Jacket:** Embroidered Tunic in blue featuring **Gold Embroidery** detailing on the collar and cuffs.
  2. **Trousers:** Matching Jet Black Trousers with a vertical Blue stripe and mirror-shined black dress boots.
  3. **Headwear:** A **Jet Black wool beret** featuring a Danubian State Tartan cloth backing patch behind a centrally mounted **Gold Honour Guard Seal**.
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### **Section 3.5: Tier II-B & III Ceremonial Specification (Governance & High Commissioner)**

1. **Jacket:** Embroidered Tunic in Green with **Gold Embroidery** detailing on the collar and cuffs.
  2. **Lower Body:** The **Danubian State Tartan Kilt** (Midnight Navy ground, Danubian Maroon grid over-check, and a razor-thin White/Gold sovereign accent line), dark hose with slate grey flashes, and black dress boots.
  3. **Headwear:** A rich **Midnight Navy wool beret** featuring the official **Gold Danubian State Crest** pinned directly to the fabric over the left eye.
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### **Section 3.6: Asset Custody, Mandatory Return, and Maintenance**

**Strict Temporary Bailment:** All issued Ceremonial Dress Uniforms remain the absolute, unalienable property of the State of Danubia. They are issued strictly on a temporary, duty-specific basis.

**Mandatory Post-Duty Return:** Immediately upon the conclusion, cessation, or stand-down of the specific public parade, consulate guard shift, or state address for which the ceremonial attire was required, the volunteer **must return the entire uniform kit to the designated Guard Quartermaster or administrative staging facility**. Retaining ceremonial assets at a private residence or utilising them for unauthorised personal or digital exhibitions is strictly prohibited.

**Centralised Professional Maintenance:** To preserve institutional consistency and prevent fabric degradation, no volunteer may attempt to home-wash, iron, or independently clean state-issued ceremonial wear. Upon mandatory return, the Administration shall directly oversee and cover all costs for the **professional dry-cleaning, pressing, and secure climate-controlled storage** of the garments, ensuring they are held in a state of continuous operational readiness.

## **ARTICLE IV: SELECTION, VETTING & ENROLMENT**

### **Section 4.1: Enrolment Prerequisites**

*Admission to the Honour Guard is strictly restricted to individuals who possess verified status as a **Tier 2 Verified E-Resident** or a **Tier 3 Permanent Citizen** of Danubia. Every candidate must maintain an unassailable record within the central files of the Commission of Civil Registry.*

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### **Section 4.2: The Citizenship Incentive Fast-Track**

*To incentivise dedicated administrative support and reward institutional fidelity:*

- 1. Any Tier 2 Verified E-Resident who successfully joins the Honour Guard and completes **12 months of continuous, unblemished service** shall become fully eligible to apply for Tier 3 Permanent Citizenship.*
  - 2. The granting of such citizenship remains strictly subject to passing any relevant background checks, security re-vetting, and a final operational review by the Guard Captain.*
  - 3. In recognition of this continued service, the Territorial Administration shall fully subsidise and cover all internal processing and manufacturing costs associated with the physical issuance of the **Danubian Passport document** to the transitioning individual.*
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### **Section 4.3: Advanced Security Screening**

*Prior to formal investiture, candidates must undergo an exhaustive, multi-layered identity audit and background investigation managed jointly by the Guard Captain and the Commission of Civil Registry. Any history of structural malice, financial fraud, parallel micro-state alignments, or bad-faith digital agitation shall result in immediate permanent disqualification.*

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### **Section 4.3: The Honour Oath of Fidelity**

*Upon successful clearance, every recruit shall swear the formal Oath of Fidelity directly to the High Commissioner, legally binding themselves to protect the sovereign archives, territorial anchors, and institutional secrets of Danubia upon pain of immediate cryptographic erasure, digital banishment, and total forfeiture of assets.*

## ARTICLE V: OPERATIONAL RESTRICTIONS & ABSOLUTE LIMITS

### Section 5.1: Absolute Civilian Status

*The Danubian Honour Guard is established exclusively as a Civilian Corps of Pageantry and Diplomatic Presence. It is entirely decoupled from any military, policing, or tactical security authority. Personnel possess no powers of detention, criminal investigation, asset protection, or physical enforcement. Their presence is strictly symbolic, designed to project the cultural identity and institutional dignity of the Administration.*

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### Section 5.2: Strictly Voluntary Mandate (Prohibition of Remuneration)

*The Honour Guard is fundamentally a **strictly voluntary unit**. Under no circumstances shall any guard member, officer, or personnel receive direct financial compensation, monetary stipends, or material payment for services rendered to the unit. Service is fueled solely by civic duty, institutional fidelity, and the non-monetary fast-track incentives defined under Article IV.*

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### Section 5.3: Absolute Prohibition of Weaponry

*To ensure unwavering compliance with peaceful international codes, civilian mandates, and the transitional administrative framework:*

- 1. The carry, deployment, or utilisation of firearms, lethal combat systems, and tactical law-enforcement weapons (including batons, chemical deterrents, or restraints) is **permanently and absolutely prohibited** across all ranks of the Honour Guard under all circumstances.*
  - 2. For formal parades, public marches, and on-land state addresses, personnel are authorised to carry strictly non-weaponised, purely decorative ceremonial items: such as, the **1.8-metre Carbon-Fibre Vanguard Lance** topped with a polished chrome spearpoint and a silk state pennant, functioning exclusively as a visual marker of territorial borders and sovereign pageantry.*
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### Section 5.4: Strict Prohibition of Independent Political Alignment

*The Honour Guard must remain completely neutral, clinical, and objective. Personnel are strictly forbidden from forming internal factions, endorsing external political narratives, or communicating with media entities regarding state assets without explicit authorisation from the High-Executive desk.*

## **ARTICLE VI: COMPLIANCE & DISCIPLINARY ENFORCEMENT**

### **Section 6.1: Code of Conduct & Public Branding**

*Members of the Guard shall maintain an impeccable standard of personal conduct and operational discretion. When displaying state insignia, uniforms, or ceremonial equipment on public or digital platforms, personnel must strictly mirror the elite, professional corporate-hardened aesthetic of the administration.*

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### **Section 6.2: Revocation of Commission**

*The Guard Captain, with the final cryptographic sign-off of the High Commissioner, is empowered to instantly strip any guard member of their rank and credentials for breaches of discipline, unauthorised external communications, or negligence of duty. Severe infractions shall automatically trigger the full disenfranchisement protocols defined in Section 4.3 of the Civil Registry and Documentation Act (ECD-CRDA-2026-002), alongside the immediate voiding of any accrued progress toward the citizenship fast-track.*

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
